HON. T. J. KNOX TAKES HIS SEAT WITH THE WAREHOUSE COMMISSIONERS

COMPLAINT TO PASS UPON

A Question That is New to the Board Comes From Minneapolis—Can a Railroad Be Compelled to Do an Act Advantageous to Itself—Northern Pacific to Adopt Great Northern's Checking System.

Commissioner Knox took his seat with the railroad and warehouse commission yesterday. A formal session was held, at which Commissioner King was made chairman, succeeding Judge Mills, retired.

The matter of disposing of the business was taken up and the new commissioner initiated into his duties. The board decided to hold regular Wednesday sessions, beginning this week, to continue until all business is cleared up.

At the meeting to be held this week the matter of the complaint brought by Minneapolis coal and wood men against the Milwaukee road will be considered. The petition asks that the road be compelled to grant such merchants facilities for transferring cars brought into the city by other lines.

The complaint, in the opinion of the commissioners, brings up a question on which no decision has ever been made in the state. The Milwaukee virtually refuses to create such facilities, but it is understood that for the services asked no compensation would be paid.
