HELEN GOULD'S GOOD WORK. Pays chaplains in Philippines from Her Own Purse.

WASHINGTON, March 27.—A visitor at the White House today, referring to the lack of chaplains with the volunteer regiments in the Philippines and elsewhere, is maintaining nine or ten chaplains in the army at her own expense.

These men are not officially recognized as chaplains, but are ministers and Y. M. C. A. workers they voluntarily and unofficially do practically the same work.

Miss Gould's monthly payment of these men \$50 a month and she makes the salaries in the Philippines. It is thought that Miss Gould's monthly payment is something like \$2,000. She shares in the same Christian workers since last fall, when the volunteers first began to go to the Philippines, and attention was called to the failure of the government to provide them. Her good work is not generally known, as all her deeds of this kind are done in the most quiet way.

EX-BANKER COLE'S CASE. His Attorneys Making a Bitter Fight for Him.
