of sound education, acquired under the most satisfactory sanitary requirements. The teachers have been subjected to many deprivations by the failure to receive their salaries when due and by the necessity of supporting their families to the city to secure the compensation which the city had contracted to pay them.

AS TO REVENUE STAMPS

Collector Von Baumbach Secures a Ruling. Collector of Internal Revenue Fred von Baumbach, says:

"A few days ago an article appeared in various papers of the West, being published originally at La Crosse, purporting to be a ruling given to a Wisconsin congressman by the commissioner of internal revenue at Washington to the effect that certificates of deposit issued by bankers were not required to have more than a two-cent stamp thereon when issued.

There was no qualifying statement given in connection with this ruling as published, which has led to very much confusion in the minds of the bankers of the West, relative to this subject. Many have applied to this office for a verification of the ruling.

Demand certificates should be stamped with two-cent stamp at the time of issue. Time certificates bearing interest, two cents for each \$100 or fraction of the time of issue. Demand certificates, containing a clause for the payment of interest, if left a specified time, two cents when issued, and if left until interest accrues, additional stamps must be attached at the rate of two cents for each \$100 or fractional part thereof, when presented for payment.

"I wrote the commissioner relative to the matter a few days ago, and I am informed that the ruling of this office is correct, notwithstanding the published article by the papers mentioned."
