She must govern her household wisely, avoiding the extremes of harshness and easiness; to consider well what needs to be done, and to "set" her people "there-to, both rathely and soon."

Idleness is especially to be guarded against when the husband is from home, and the housewife must not stint to bear a hand herself in the household work.
