

MURDERED FOR HIS OWN GUILT

WALLERT WAS FOUND HIDDEN IN THE MANGER IN A BARN

FREELY ADMITTED HIS GUILT

Says He Went to His Old Home Intending to Burn the Barn When His Wife's Screams Excited Him.

ARLINGTON, Minn., Aug. 21.—Theodore Wallert, the murderer of his wife and four stepchildren, was found by a boy early this forenoon under a manger in the barn on his relatives' farm...

The boy was much frightened, but had the good sense to run at once for help. He gave the alarm to James O'Hara, a very man of Fairfax, and to others who happened to be in the vicinity, and Wallert was in a short time in custody.

While the feeling in town is strong against the murderer, there is little danger that the course of the law will be interfered with. It is felt that Wallert has already placed the halter about his own neck and that full justice will be meted.

The country people are, however, wild with excitement and a mob might easily be organized. Little protection could be given to Wallert, and there would probably be but one result—the ignominious death of the murderer.

The manner of the mother and her four children were held at the same time at their recent home this afternoon and their bodies were laid side by side in the cemetery about two miles from the house. The cause of the death of the numbers of people who came from all parts of the county and who expressed the keenest sorrow for those slain and the deepest indignation toward their destroyer.

While the bodies of the murdered woman and her children were receiving the last attentions preparatory to removal to the cemetery, and while the religious services were being held in progress, Wallert was in the hands of his captors and was taken along the road in front of the home where his bloody hands had struck the first blow, and was quickly grasped by some on the outside, and in an instant cries of "lynch him" were heard and a crowd of men and boys surged forward in hostile demonstration.
