Record of Log Rollers.

The annual report of the Minnesota and Northern Wisconsin railway was filed yesterday with the railroad commission. It shows the annual gross earnings of the road to have been \$3,569, operating expenses \$2,171, leaving a net income of \$1,398 from operation.

MANAGERS' ANNUAL MEETING

The board of managers of the Northern Pacific meeting in this city yesterday at the general offices of the Northern Pacific, the report for the year was submitted, and it shows that the association has enjoyed a very satisfactory degree of progress during the past twelve months.

The receipts for the year were \$12,170,82, the largest in the history of the organization. Its annual receipts for the year ending June 30, 1899, were \$9,141,53. The total expenses for the year ending June 30, 1899, were \$9,236,22, as compared with \$8,871,51 for the preceding year. This left for the year just ended a surplus of \$2,939,60, while the surplus the year before was only \$2,277,07. The increase in the surplus has been therefore \$662,53.

The number of patients treated during the past year at the Brainerd hospital was 1,351, and at the Missoula hospital 1,507. The total number of patients treated during the year was 2,858. With the exception of the number of patients at the Missoula hospital all these numbers are less than for the year ending June 30, 1899.

The officers for the year just closed were re-elected. They are the following: President, M. C. Kimberley; vice-president, L. T. Chamberlain; secretary, W. A. Laidlaw; treasurer, C. A. Clark; controller, H. A. Gray.

OLD PLAN IS CONTINUED.

Northern Pacific and Soo Reveal Agreement to Interchange Traffic.

When the St. Paul & Duluth road was operated independently of the Northern Pacific, before the latter purchased the former road, it had an agreement with the Soo line whereby freight traffic was interchanged at Bald Eagle, and by a similar agreement the Northern Pacific interchanged traffic with the Soo at Greenwood. Both of these contracts have existed for years, but since the consolidation of the two roads it has been necessary for the agreements to be renewed. Consequently the officers of the Soo and Northern Pacific have made arrangements whereby this system will be continued.

The statement that the agreement which has recently been renewed involves the Soo's right to transport freight over the Northern Pacific tracks to Duluth lacks confirmation. Vice President Bradford, of the N. P., stated yesterday in a Globe reporter that the agreement involved no new features, to his knowledge, but was merely a continuance of the old.

NOT A PASSENGER KILLED.

Omaha Establishes a Fine Record for Careful Work.

In its annual report, which the Globe recently received, the Omaha road makes some very unusual facts that are very unusual. During the entire year ending June 30, 1900, the road did not kill a single passenger. There were twelve people killed by trains during the year, but the records show all of these to have been trespassers and employees. The first named, of course, had no business on the road, and the latter are said to have lost their lives principally through their own carelessness. This, of course, is a fact which can not be exactly determined.

On the entire Omaha system there were during the year in which fatalities were so scarce a total of 1,966,221 passengers carried.
