the defense, stated he would show that the money had never been claimed by Lindelle; that Lindelle had left the house under protest; that O'Leary had been notified shortly after he left it that he could get it again whenever he wished, etc.

A. E. Edwards was called by the defense and testified that while in the station at Larimore, two years ago, he had overheard parts of a conversation between Lindelle and O'Leary, and that the former told O'Leary that Lindelle could get his \$100 back any time he called for it. He also swore that a week ago last Monday he was at Mr. Lindelle's residence, where Lindelle returned to O'Leary by Lindelle. He stated he heard the latter protest and that he left the money with Lindelle two years ago under the latter's protest.

Mr. Lindelle then took the stand in his own behalf. He stated that O'Leary had called at his house several times, and asked to induce him to take the money, but that he had refused at all times to accept it; that two years ago last August O'Leary came to his house and left \$100 in a box, and that he (Lindelle) refused to accept it, and that afterwards when in Larimore, he told O'Leary he could have the money at any time. He stated that he had written the letter which was after O'Leary's place at Larimore had been closed, and that he wrote it after having received one from a man in Larimore stating that O'Leary was bootlegging again. O'Leary had promised Lindelle in September, '98, at the time that Lindelle and J. B. Wineman were at Larimore securing evidence in support of the injunction which had closed O'Leary's place of business, that he would quit the business forever, and that as it was the object, primarily, of the injunction to stop the sale of liquor, he, with Mr. Wineman, had agreed not to prosecute O'Leary if he would quit. He believed that O'Leary meant to keep his promise, and when he received the letter above referred to he simply wrote to O'Leary that he had better leave the town, as that would be the best way to settle the matter. He stated he had signed the letter "Jack," as O'Leary had told him to sign that way. He said he returned the \$100 to O'Leary last week, and would have done so at any time had the latter called for it.

**INDIAN AND MILITARY ACADEMY APPROPRIATION BILLS PASSED**

**USE PRUNING KNIFE FREELY**

**Committee on Rivers and Harbors Cuts Its Appropriation Bill Down to Sixty Million Dollars.**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.—The house today passed the Indian and the military academy appropriation bills. The former carries \$9,936,528, and the latter \$70,151,151. The principal decrease in the military academy bill was in the appropriation for the five civilized tribes commission. Immediately after the approval of the bill today the house appointed a committee of the whole and entered upon the consideration of the Indian appropriation bill.

Mr. Sherman (N. Y.), who was in charge of the bill, explained the measure, which carries \$33,238 more than the law for the current year. The main items of increase are those appropriating \$1,500,000 for fulfilling treaty stipulation with the Apaches, Kiowas and Comanches; \$500,000 for the Chippewas, of Minnesota, and \$125,000 for the Fort Hall Indians. The principal decrease is \$47,000 for the five civilized tribes commission. The bill was passed.

The military academy appropriation bill was then taken up. It carried \$70,151,151—\$25,845 more than the current law. Mr. Hull (Ia.), chairman of the military committee, explained that the principal item of increase was for the centennial celebration, to be held at the academy July 4, 1901.

TO STOP HAZING.
