

MANITOBA'S PREMIER SAYS RAILROAD DEAL WILL NOT BE DISALLOWED

WAS IN ST. PAUL YESTERDAY

Strain of Strenuous Session Necessitates Visit to Hot Springs—Parliament Considering the Measure.

Premier Roblin thinks there is no danger of the federal parliament at Ottawa disallowing the act of the Manitoba legislature ratifying the deal entered into by the province and the Northern Pacific railroad.

Mr. Roblin was in St. Paul yesterday, with Mrs. Roblin, en route to Hot Springs, Ark. He will be absent from the effects of the somewhat strenuous session, when spoken regarding the fate of the bill, the premier said that he did not think the federal parliament would interfere with the act passed by the house. Most of the talk against the deal was, in his opinion, so obviously inspired by the Canadian Pacific that it could not be taken for unbiased expression of opinion.

Mr. Roblin's views on the matter are not shared by J. H. Brock, a member of the Ottawa committee, which went to Ottawa from Winnipeg to protest against the bill being allowed. The latter has just returned from the capital, and in an interview, says that eminent counsel, who have looked into the matter, have entered into by the province and the railway company, pronounce them ultra vires.

The principal legal objection to the contracts seems to be that the Dominion has the right to regulate rates, and that therefore the provinces cannot take it upon themselves to regulate rates of roads in their own borders.

This objection, however, is not a fatal one, in the opinion of the counsel for the province, who claim that legislation in the interests of the people is never interfered with by the higher house. At Ottawa, too, there is a strong sentiment that Manitoba should be left alone in this matter. It is regarded as being purely a provincial question, and most of the members of parliament should not be asked to pronounce on the merits of the case.


