E. A. HENDRICKSON DEAD

LIFE-LONG AND PROMINENT CITIZEN OF ST. PAUL DIES OF GRIPPE

FUNERAL SERVICES TOMORROW

Had Lived in St. Paul for Fifty Years, and Was Identified With Its Interests.

Lathrop E. Reed, banker, philanthropist, and one of St. Paul's most prominent citizens, passed away yesterday morning on a private car at Lexington, Ky., as he was speeding toward this city, where he hoped to die.

Mr. Reed has lived in St. Paul since 1851, and became associated with the banking firm of Thomas Bros. in 1852. A year later he became connected with the First National bank, and afterward entered the firm of Dawson & Co., with which he remained until 1870.

Mr. Reed was in youth, characterized by a placid, unassuming bearing which later contributed so much to his success as a banker. In 1852, having nothing else to do, he hired out to do rough work on Gov. Ramsey's farm near Lake Cormier.
