JULY WHEAT AT CHICAGO CLOSED AT A LOSS OF SEVEN-EIGHTHS. CORN ABLE TO HOLD ITS OWN. Oats an Eighth of a Cent Up and Very Active—Provisions Dull, but Closed a Shade Higher.

Chicago, May 14.—The fall of needed rain weakened the total, and July closed 1/2 cent lower, but the bull party managed to support corn, while July closed a shade up. July oats closed 1/2 cent higher and provisions a shade to 1/2 cent improved.

Wheat opened weak on disappointing cables, July 1/2 cent to 1/4 cent lower at 7 1/2 cent to 7 3/4 cent. The price gradually advanced to 7 3/4 cent, when reports of rain in Oklahoma and Southern Kansas, and disappointed world's view, stated a reaction and the market fell steadily to 7 1/2 cent, closing weak and 1/2 cent lower at 7 1/4 cent.

Provisions were dull, but strong, in sympathy with the excellent demand for corn and oats at higher prices, helped as well by an advance in the price of short duration, and the price of the short account. Following the decline in wheat the price eased off to 44 1/2 cent, closing firm and 1/2 cent higher at 45 1/2 cent.
