

IS HURT INTERNALLY

D. D. HARRINGTON KNOCKED DOWN BY INTERURBAN ELECTRIC CAR

INJURIES ARE DANGEROUS

Attempting to Cross Track on University Avenue, East-bound Car Hurled Him to the Ground Unconscious.

E. D. Harrington, who lives at 325 Madison street, was struck by an interurban car yesterday afternoon at the corner of Marion and University avenue, receiving injuries of a very dangerous character.

Mr. Harrington had just alighted from one car at the corner mentioned and, passing behind it, started to cross the other track, when he was struck by an east-bound car which had failed to observe. He was hurled to the ground and rendered unconscious.

Upon examination the physicians found that Mr. Harrington had sustained internal injuries in the chest and abdomen. His tongue was severely bitten and ugly bruises marked his back, chest and limbs.
