

TO PREVENT FLOODS

TRILL-STATE DRAINAGE COMMISSION TO HOLD THREE DAYS' SESSION IN FARGO. FIGURES WILL BE SUBMITTED

System of Reservoirs to Hold Water Produced by Spring Thaws Will Be Advocated. FARGO, N. D., July 14.—(Special.)—Tuesday will be the opening day of the Trill-State Drainage and Canal meeting in Fargo. Three days will be devoted to the consideration of plans for the prevention of floods in the Red river valley.

Under the methods suggested it is thought that a system of reservoirs on the Otter Tail, Botts and Sioux and Red Lake rivers will control at least 20 to 30 per cent of the volume of water annually poured into the Red river valley after the spring thaws occur. If this percentage can be held back, the river will be able to handle the rest, and all danger of disastrous floods will be obviated.
