

CUT RATES IN FORCE

GREAT WESTERN SET THE PACE AND OTHER ROADS MIT THEM TICKETS SOLD ON THREE DAYS

Elks Convention at Milwaukee Provokes the Disturbance Among St. Paul-Chicago Lines Yesterday.

The flat rate of \$1.50 to Chicago and return, as announced yesterday by the Chicago Great Western road, and which will be in effect during the Elks' convention this week at Milwaukee, was promptly met by the other lines, but it is not thought that any further reduction will be attempted.

Up to yesterday the roads had agreed upon a round-trip rate of \$1.50, but the action of the Great Western set the agents of the other roads to hustling, and the result stated. As it now stands the delegates to the convention, and the public, have the benefit of a 25 per cent reduction from the rate formerly agreed upon.

The reduced rate will be in effect to-day, Monday and Tuesday, and tickets will be good to return until July 27, but on depositing 50 cents with the joint agent in Chicago the return limit may be extended to Aug. 10.

The unexpected cut in rates is ascribed to Traffic Manager Storr, of the Great Western road, but this official states that the one-fare arrangement is only intended for particular events, and, in this case, the cut is made to meet the low rates which will be made by the boats that ply between Chicago and Milwaukee.

This shaking up of the St. Paul-Chicago rates during the time of the Elks' convention in Milwaukee was predicted by the Globe in a recent issue. The bulk of the Chicago fare will naturally go to the roads running via Milwaukee on account of the reduced rates in effect during the Elks' convention, July 21 to 23. The Milwaukee lines did not act favorably to the idea of the other Chicago lines reducing their rates during the three days referred to.


