

UNDER ORDERS

BATTLESHIP WISCONSIN TO BE HELD IN READINESS TO GO TO PANAMA

A MEASURE OF PRECAUTION

Big War Vessel Will Proceed From Anacortes, Wash., to San Francisco, There to Await Orders.

INSURGENTS MORE ACTIVE

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—Just before the navy department closed today an order was sent to Capt. George C. Retzer, of the battleship Wisconsin, now at Anacortes, near the Puget sound naval station, to proceed to San Francisco, from which point the battleship will be dispatched to Panama.

TO AWAIT ORDERS

While this was not a request for a ship, yet Mr. Hackett felt that it was quite desirable to have one in readiness to go should the request be made, and therefore directed that the order be sent to the Wisconsin to come down to San Francisco and there await further orders.

TRUST OFFICERS ARE BUSY

More Mills Are Reopened by the Steel Corporation With Forces of Non-Union Steel Workers and Laborers.

STRIKE LEADERS CONFIDENT

PITTSBURG, Pa., Aug. 8.—The contending sides in the steel strike are centering their energies for a show of strength in a study day that the general strike order becomes effective. The United States Steel corporation is reopening mills closed by the first strike call to show its independence of unions and gathering strength wherever it may to lighten the effect of the general strike order, and the Amalgamated association bends its energies to the extension of its membership to obtain the support and co-operation of the American Federation of Labor.

STRIKERS ARE CONFIDENT

President Shaffer and his associates on the other side insist that the strike order will be generally obeyed, and that they will obtain more than enough support to cripple the steel corporation.

TRUST STARTS MILLS

The steel corporation succeeded today in getting the Farm mill at the Lindsay & McCutcheon plant and another mill at the headquarters of the corporation also reopened reports that at Hyde Park last night four of the mills did perfect work, and an announcement from Wellsville that the strike was over.
