CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—Corn was leader in the market today. The close was strong and higher. December closed with a gain of 1/4c, December wheat 1/2c, and provisions 7/8c to 1c higher than the close.

Provisions were quiet and steady, with lead leading in strength. Comparatively little stock and an active market were the bulk factors. January pork sold at \$11.00 1/2, closing with a gain of 1/4c.
