DEATH TO THE REDS

SOCIETY FOR THEIR EXTINCTION IS FORMED AT SIOUX CITY. CITY.

WILL FIGHT FIRE WITH FIRE. Members of Order So Far Initiated Sworn to Absolute Secrecy—Anarchists Are to Be Hunted Down.

SIOUX CITY, Iowa, Sept. 13.—As mysterious and powerful as the Mafia and the highlanders to erring Chicago, will be a national and anarchist society formed in Sioux City since the shooting of President McKinley.

Its object is to rid the country of all who advocate the murder of public officials and the overthrowing of the law. Its declaration is that all persons to whom the American government is reluctant to grant the right of citizenship and invitation to leave the country. The society's defense of its methods is that the end justifies the means; fire must be met with fire; Sioux must be fought with poison.

Thirty Sioux City men have banded themselves into a society which is destined to extend to the uttermost parts of the United States, only twenty men, all residents of Sioux City, know the mysteries of the newly formed society, and they compose the board of managers, being of the highest priority of membership. They only will know of the inside workings of the society.

The first information of the society's existence came when Attorney W. T. Stafford, who the day of the attack upon President McKinley, knocked down a ruffian who commended the assassin, was cautiously approached and after assurance of his sympathy was asked to draw up a constitution and by-laws. The organizer, a Sioux City man, made Stafford solemnly swear never to reveal his identity. The only officers now known are the secretary and board of managers. Two cipher codes will be used, one for correspondence and another for the minutes of meetings. The former code will be known only to the three oldest members to take the secretary's place in case of death or disability.

It will be the duty of every member to report the whereabouts of an anarchist. Once branded with the mysterious mark of this organization the offender will be persecuted with even more bitterness than attended the members of the Ku-Klux-Klan during the Civil war.

Winona Winnings. WINONA, Minn., Sept. 13.—The first definite word was received here today regarding the meeting of the North German conference in this city next week. Bishop Cronan was this morning expected to arrive in Winona, but the illness of his wife has prevented his keeping some previous engagements. A letter was received today from the bishop to the effect that he will be here next week for the conference. In addition to the Sunday morning conference, a general assembly will be held at the pulpit at the Central Methodist church in the evening of that day, when he will speak on "America's Sin." The meeting is from the standpoint of Christian Missions.

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MAILED THE STRIKE

PRESIDENT SHAFFER IS SAID TO HAVE LEFT PITTSBURGH FOR NEW YORK.

RUMORS OF SETTLEMENT. Feeling Among the Members of the Amalgamated Association Is That the Struggle Is Over.

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 13.—The absence of President Shaffer from Amalgamated headquarters was noted today, and when the day passed he had not appeared. The officials of the organization are expected to discuss the strike in any form, and they did not know where Mr. Shaffer was. It was learned tonight that President Shaffer had left for New York, presumably under an agreement with the steel people to settle the strike.

It cannot be said positively that this is the case, but all evidence points to the indications early in the day were that a settlement of the strike was looked for by the Amalgamated men. This belief was strengthened by the current issue of the Amalgamated Journal, which told of President Shaffer's renewed effort for negotiations. His present trip to New York is believed to be the consummation of these efforts. Until the result is known no developments are expected in the strike situation.

A notice posted at the Star plant of the tin plate company today that nothing has or can occur in the future to affect the operation of the plant on a strictly non-union basis is regarded as a denial of the above.

The Amalgamated Journal in today's issue gives the result of the Civic federation conference in New York. The members received the acceptance of the final terms of the combine, but the Journal says President Shaffer was unable to get the executive committee together before the expiration of the time limit. The Amalgamated board then decided to make another effort to get negotiations started, and President Shaffer at once proceeded to ascertain what could be accomplished.

During the morning two carriages of non-union men were captured by Monaghan in plate strikers and the latter were taken to the city jail. The strikers eluded the McKeesport strikers and entered the tube works.

One report had it that a settlement had been effected with the American tin plate officials, and that a meeting would now be held with the officials of the steel company.

NEW YORK, Sept. 13.—It was learned today from a reliable source that proposals for a settlement of the steel strike are again under consideration in this city.

It was also stated that President Shaffer is expected here today or tomorrow, but that his coming is not the result of any communication from this city.

NOT A SIGN OF RETREAT. SHOWN IN THE FACE OF EMMA GOLDMAN. Says She Feels for Mrs. McKinley, But Can't See How the Death of the President Affects Her.

CHICAGO, Sept. 13.—When shown the Associated Press dispatches announcing the inevitable death of the president, Emma Goldman, the anarchist lecturer, now being held at the city jail, showed itself in a state of surprise. "I do not see how that can affect my case," she added, "if it is carried on lawfully and legally. They have no evidence against me. Chief Bull and Chief O'Neil have admitted that they have none. They are holding me without evidence. The death of McKinley would only lengthen my term of imprisonment if they convicted me on the charge of conspiracy for the sake of Mrs. McKinley; outside of that I have no sympathy."

WALL STREET IS PREPARED. Clearing House Committee Ready for the Emergency. NEW YORK, Sept. 13.—Despite the unfavorable reports from the street from Buffalo concerning the presidential election, the clearing house committee did not meet today. The members of the committee say that the election is entirely unnecessary. At the last meeting several days ago, it was claimed, contingency. The claim is also made that the situation is largely due to the fact that the worst was expected today, while the stock markets were open. Nothing in the nature of a panic developed.
