MINNESOTA HAS ONE OF THE VERY BEST IN THE UNITED STATES. KNIGHTS OPENED THEIR CONVENTION YESTERDAY WITH LARGE ATTENDANCE. TOTAL MEMBERSHIP OF 8,500. FINANCIAL REPORT SHOWS ORDER IN PROSPEROUS CONDITION—TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS EXPENDED FOR RELIEF IN 1900.

The grand domain of Minnesota, Knights of Pythias, met in annual convention at the capitol yesterday. The morning session was an open one, J. F. Hilscher, of St. Paul, and representative, presiding. After brief remarks, Hilscher introduced Gov. Van Sant, who welcomed the delegates.

A. H. Stobart, representing the city, and Mayor Smith extended a cordial welcome to the delegates. Mr. Stobart stated that the usual signs of welcome to the grand delegates was because the lodge had requested that no such display be made.

The lodge went into executive session and the routine business of the day was taken up. Committees were appointed and reports were read. There were in attendance 215 delegates and past officers.

The report of the grand keeper of records and seal showed a total membership of the state of Minnesota of 8,567 on July 1. During the past year the increase to the amount of \$1,400 has been given by the subordinate lodges, being contributed to Galveston, Jacksonville, Schenectady, New York, and Wisconsin.

The annual financial statement of the lodge showed a balance on hand, Sept. 1, of \$8,621, after an expenditure during the year of \$7,352. The receipts from subordinate lodges during the past year were \$1,350, less than during previous years and the expenditures \$1,342 less.
