Termination of Relationship of Carrier and Passenger—A passenger on a railway train has been held by the court of civil appeals of Texas, in the case of Texas & P. R. Co., vs. Dick, 63 S. W. 885, to remain such after alighting from the train and while in the depot premises of the company...

Civil Death—The disposition of property of persons sentenced to life imprisonment is considered by the supreme court of Kansas in the case of Smith v. Beckler, 84 Pacific Reporter, 70. The statute provides that "whenever any convict shall be imprisoned under sentence for life, his estate, property and effects shall be administered and disposed of in all respects as if he were naturally dead."

NEW YORK, Oct. 12.—According to the Boston correspondent of the World, the Bulgarian police are assured that Miss Ellen M. Stone, the kidnapped American missionary, has been conducted by twenty brigands close to the village of Lakaruta, in Turkish territory.

Liability of Owner of Elevator for Injuries—The owner of a passenger elevator for the use of tenants and others in a building has been held by the supreme court of Massachusetts, in the case of Seaver v. Bradley, 90 Northeast Reporter, 755, to be under no obligation to carry passengers, and not to be a common carrier of passengers within the meaning of the statute relating to the liabilities of common carriers of passengers, and hence is not liable for the death of a passenger caused by the elevator not being in proper repair.

Anti-Scauper Law Unconstitutional—New York Laws of 1901, c. 670, prohibiting the sale of railroad tickets by "scalpers," is held unconstitutional in the case of People ex rel. Wei, v. Hagan, 71 New York Supplement, 461. Judge Gildersleeve holds that the present law is substantially the same as the law of 1887, which was held unconstitutional by the court of appeals, and quotes from the opinion of the latter court, as follows: "A law which prohibits the selling of tickets of passage on railway trains by any person except common carriers and their authorized agents transcends the police power and violates the constitutional guarantees in so far as it undertakes to prohibit citizens from engaging in the business of brokerage in passage tickets."

Law as to Fellow Servants—The Indiana enactment known as the "employers' liability act," which regulates the liability of a railroad corporation for injuries to its employees, has recently been construed in the case of the Indianapolis Union Railway company vs. Houlihan, 60 Northeast Reporter, 93. The court holds that the section making railroad corporations liable for injuries to their employees the same as strangers, where the injury is caused by the negligence of locomotive engineers or trainmen, etc., whether the employee was acting in obedience to the orders of the master or on his own initiative, is not in conflict with the equality clause of the federal constitution.

THE STANDARD. UNCLE SAM'S MONDGRAN WHISKY. SOFTIA, Bulgaria, Oct. 12.—An official communication which has just been issued here indignantly protests against the assertion that the Bulgarian government has been conspiring with the Macedonian committee in regard to the abduction of Miss Stone, the American missionary. The note points out that, while nothing is positively known of the composition of the brigand band, it was undoubtedly formed in Turkey. Miss Stone was captured near Mehonia, a short distance from a Turkish post, and her captors were seen Oct. 9, in the hills between the Turkish villages of Fleschitzka and Jaka-
