THREE IN THE RACE

MINNESOTA, WISCONSIN AND MICHIGAN ARE THE WESTERN FOOTBALL FACTORS

Turning to Minnesota, it must be admitted that she outclassed Nebraska more clearly than the score indicates. A combination of bad luck and bad generalship prevented the Gophers from running up as high a score as the comparative strength of the two teams called for.
