MINNESOTA MAN WRITES ENTUSIASTIC LETTER TO WISCONSIN STUDENT

OLD VICTORIES ARE RECALLED

Wisconsin Is Confident, However, and King Has Many New Plays to Spring on Minnesota.

MADISON, Wis., Oct. 10.—The eyes of football followers in Middle West are now centered on Madison, where the annual game between Wisconsin and Minnesota will be played Nov. 16, and present prospects indicate that thousands of Wisconsin's enthusiasts will attend the great contest, which will determine the championship of the Western universities.

The following letter, received here from one of the students who is attending Minnesota university and who during the past, been actively connected with the athletic teams of that institution, indicates the general feeling of the students regarding the matter.

"I note with great delight the degree of confidence you display in regard to Wisconsin's ability to defeat us, and I will now proceed to show you a little of the outcome and incidentally show you where you are wrong, and show you, taking all things into consideration, if both teams play the best football they are capable of, your chances for winning are very small.

Old Glory Victories Recalled. "Already the students up here are beginning to recall the time when Minnesota used to beat you people 60 to 0. That was in the early stages of the game, and is still a fond remembrance with us, and while we do not think that the score this year will be that big, still we are feeling certain of a decided victory.

"Taking the matter seriously, it is almost absurd for you to think so seriously of winning. I can see how you might possibly hope to tie the score, but how you can do anything more than that is more than I can figure out. A comparison of the two teams will show that, as they line up on paper, we are far superior, and should win by a good margin.

How the Teams Compare. "In the line I feel that we have a great advantage, and I fail to see how your boasted back field can prove any stronger than the one which we will have almost an even thing with you there. In the line and end work your strong right side will be against our left side, with things about even, although this is not the bulk of the play. Your left side will be against our right side, which is a better advantage over your left side, and is to be a big factor in this contest.

"In the back field, we come out good, but what I fail to see is where you claim your immense superiority. Your backs are fast, yet they are no faster than our own. Your line is a whole lot faster than Driver, and is a better all-around player. Both of our backs are as fast as either Larson or Coehens. Your men may get away together better than we, but individually they are no better. Backman is one of the best half-backs in the West, which certainly means that he has some speed. La Fane will also class with Larson as a line runner. Although he may not be as good, he is not outclassed.

"So far this season I have noticed that Wisconsin depended almost entirely on its runs, that is a good game to play if the object is to run up a big score. Nevertheless, in a close, hard game, that style of play would not count for much. In a big game between first-class teams each side will play as a rule a game that is seldom resorted to, and such a game they usually result in a loss. No doubt, you will try that game with us, and you will meet with the most successful success of any play in the hard game, and if you then resort to the work you will strike a hard proposition. As far as end running is concerned, the man that succeeds in getting around our original American line will deserve all the credit there is. If that should happen we have a man backing up the line whom Hefflinger says can make good on any team in the country. At quarter back is a more experienced man than either of your candidates.

"We are coming down to that game with no hard luck stories, and if we are beaten will take it as my nothing. However, we feel that the merry whistle of the Gopher will be heard on Camp Hill.
