Representatives Will Gather in Chicago to Decide on Compromise—Freight Rates Are Demoralized.

MERRILLY CUTTING RATES.

All Roads Will Take a Brace After Jan. 1.

As the first of the approaches and the Christmas traffic becomes heavy the old freight fights as to rates again occupies the center of interest in railroad circles.

While the majority of roads are cutting rates, or will cut them on west-bound freight from St. Paul, there is a scarcity of cars which will prevent any cutting on Eastern shipments.

The same trouble is being experienced in Minneapolis in regard to freight cars in particular and rates in general.

A meeting of Western executives was held in New York recently in regard to the car shortage and it was proposed that a per diem charge for the use of cars be made in order to expedite shipments, but no action was taken.
