Line to White Bear Sold.

The papers in the sale of the Minneapolis & St. Louis line running from Minneapolis to a junction with the White Bear line to the Northern Pacific, were filed with the register of deeds yesterday. The line is fifteen miles long and the consideration named in the transfer papers was \$1, and the assumption of a mortgage of \$200,000, held by the Fidelity Trust Company of Philadelphia. The deed is dated Nov. 29.

SPARKS FROM THE RAILS.

The Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul will build at its West Milwaukee shops 100 cars of 100-ton capacity, and 500 50-foot furniture cars. It is stated that the North-Western line will be extended to the west coast, a branch from Princeton west to Elroy, Wis., a distance of about sixty miles. The survey has been made.

WAGES ARE ADVANCED.

The Pennsylvania Railroad company recently announced that it had advanced the wages of its men, with few exceptions, their wages had been advanced, to date from Jan. 1. This advance, however, was not in most instances. The increase will require the payment of several hundred thousand dollars a month more than is now paid on the scale.

ALASKA TRAFFIC HEAVY.

Seattle newspapers report that traffic last year into Dawson, Alaska, was as follows: Freight received in 1901 exceeded that received in 1900 by 4,483 tons, and receipts from the Yukon river by 1,350 tons and by lower river 13,530 tons, making a total of 35,577 tons. In 1900 the traffic was 30,000 tons. The increase was 11,277 tons by lower river, a total of 22,000 tons. Both routes made gains, the upper river carrying 1,350 tons more than lower river 2,900 tons. More goods of Canadian manufacture were taken into Dawson this year than ever before. It is estimated that 60 per cent of the freight of all classes for 1901 was Canadian manufacture.

OFFICIALS DENY RUMOR.

President Cassatt, of the Pennsylvania Railroad, makes a statement.
