It is hereby ordered by the Common Council of the City of St. Paul: That the matter of trading on street from Hope street to Maple street, as per petition hereto attached, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works to investigate and report thereon.

Second—Give the Council an estimate of the expense thereof, and state whether or not the cost thereof is to be paid into the City Treasury before the completion of the work.

Third—Can real estate to be assessed for said improvement be found benefited by the improvement, and if so, what expenses necessary to be incurred thereby.

Fourth—Is such improvement asked for by a majority or application of the owners of a majority of the property to be assessed for such improvement?

Fifth—Should the Council a plan or program of the proposed improvement, and file of said improvement with the City Clerk, if you report in favor of the same.

Sixth—Should the Council a proper order directing the work to be done.
