"FRISCO" BUYS A LINE.

Reported that the System Has Purchased the Oklahoma & Western.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Feb. 19.—It is reported here on good authority that the Oklahoma Western road has been purchased by the Frisco system.

This line is being constructed from Oklahoma City to Quanah, Tex., on the Colorado Southern. It will cross the city, crossing the Rock Island at the same place, thence through Lawton, the new city.

The Oklahoma & Western line, in addition to traversing the new reservation just opened, gives the Frisco direct connection with the Colorado Southern. It will be in operation by Jan. 1 next.

N. & K. ROAD IS SOLD.

Tennessee Central Makes Payment of \$500,000 on the System.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Feb. 19.—The sale of the Nashville Knoxville railway to the Tennessee Central has been consummated according to a telegram received from President Shepley, of the Union Trust company of St. Louis.

The Nashville & Knoxville extends from Monterey to Lebanon, Tenn., 110 miles, and is the essential link in the proposed Tennessee Central system.

NEW PRESIDENT ELECTED.

Thos. P. Fowler at the Head of the Metropolitan Security Company.

NEW YORK, Feb. 19.—Thomas Powell Fowler, president of the New York, Ontario & Western railway, has been elected president of the Metropolitan Security company and of the Interurban Railway company. It is not known whether he will hold the other positions.

The latter is the tentative lease of the Metropolitan Street railway, pending the endorsement of the plan by the stockholders of the city-owned Metropolitan security company, which will guarantee a 7 per cent dividend on the stock of the Metropolitan Street railway.

Mr. Fowler is a representative on the board of many railway companies.

GREAT WESTERN'S EARNINGS.

Gross Receipts Continue to Grow Each Week.

The earnings of the Chicago Great Western for the second week in February were \$133,500.30, or an increase of over \$7,000 over the same period a year ago, when they amounted to \$126,500.70.

The earnings of the road since the beginning of the fiscal year, July 1, to date, have been \$4,941,190.75 against \$4,841,146.33 a year ago, or an increase of nearly \$200,000.

Elevated Deal Is Off.

CHICAGO, Feb. 18.—It is reported that the deal for the Evanston line of the Milwaukee & St. Paul by the Northwestern is off.

Officials of the Milwaukee & St. Paul say that the elevated road interests concluded that the cost of taking over the steam road's branch, the Chicago and North Western, elevation of the light way, increased equipment, power houses, etc., would not warrant a contract for the power, public utility and other interests.

Just what will be done with the Evanston line of the Milwaukee & St. Paul has not yet been known, but the proposed deal is not likely that further attempts to boom it as a passenger route will be made. It is valuable to the company as a freight line, as it affords connections with a number of manufacturing plants.

Gross Earnings of Roads.

The gross earnings of thirty-seven roads for the first week in February were \$42,196,642.66, against \$40,500,333.33 for the first week of February, 1921, a decrease of \$1,696,309.33.

Eighteen roads show increases in net earnings, but the corresponding roads referred to above earned \$25,672,721.45, an increase of \$1,357,526 over the \$24,315,195.45 reported for the corresponding period last year. For the longer period thirty-three show increases and four decreases.

That I, the undersigned for the purpose of becoming incorporated and creating a corporation under and pursuant to the provisions of the Chapter 41 of the General Laws of the State of Minnesota, 1922, and of the acts amendatory thereto, have caused to be executed and adopted and have caused to be filed in the office of the Secretary of State of Minnesota, and of the acts amendatory thereto, the following articles of incorporation:

First—The name of the corporation shall be the Minnesota, Iowa and Eastern Railway Company; and the general location of the principal office of the corporation shall be the building, constructing and operating of railroad or railroads with the lines of said railroad from and to such points within said State as may be
