LOUISVILLE & NASHVILLE ROAD IS AWARDED \$232,551 FROM BRIDGE COMPANY

LOSS OF PAPERS IS COSTLY
Failure to Preserve Original Way-bills and Receipts Entails Clear Loss of Half a Million Dollars.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Feb. 24.—Judge Sterling H. Toney, of the circuit court today gave judgment for \$232,551 in favor of the Louisville & Nashville railway against the Louisville Bridge company and the Pittsburg, Chicago, Cincinnati and St. Louis railway.

The Louisville & Nashville claimed that it was kept ignorant among the three roads, and the administration of the road having changed the contract of 1872, was overlooked.
