

TO AID HANSBROUGH

CHIEF OF THE REASONS WHY THE IRRIGATION BILL IS BEING PUSHED

NORTH DAKOTAN IN DANGER

How "Senatorial Courtesy" Works—Why McCarry Dodged Reciprocity Bill—Spooner's Attitude as to Cuba Attracts Attention.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 12.—Senator Henry C. Hansbrough, of North Dakota, is bending every energy to securing the passage of the irrigation bill which bears his name. He is even more energetic since the house irrigation committee voted to substitute his for the Newlands bill. This makes the legislation certain to bear his name if passed. He is encouraged to hope now that it may become a law; the recent conference and compromise reached at them have done much toward removing the obstacles.

Was Backed by Hansbrough.

The bill which passed the senate was expected to pass the house. One of the principal reasons why it slipped through so easily was because it was known that it was needed by Hansbrough in his political business out home and that it is an argument which appeals to "senatorial courtesy." They all have to be re-elected and most of them are liable to difficulties, and if there is anything they can do to get re-elected out of the rat they are quite willing to turn to and do it.

But Hansbrough is not satisfied with the empty glory of passing a bill which languishes and dies on the other side. So he has been energetically stirring up the president and has succeeded in arranging two cabinet resignations at the White house at which the objectionable features of the senate and house bills were gone over and the president stated what he thought ought to be done in the way of making changes. The suggestions coming from the White house were received with more consideration than they would have been if they had come merely from the author of the senate bill, and the consequence is a compromise measure on which there is a pretty good prospect of getting the house to act.

Wants to Help Edwards.

Another stone which Hansbrough has not left unturned is his forcing the president and preparing his fields for re-election is the securing of an appointment for Maj. A. W. Edwards, of the Fargo Forum. Maj. Edwards has not yet landed, but the president has promised that he will have "something equally as good." He will be taken care of before long.

It is understood here all the same that Hansbrough is going to have a lively time to get back. His enemies have pounced upon the Noyes-McKenzie-Cape Nome mining scandal, and in a way Hansbrough is made responsible for the misdeeds of his appointee. The campaign has been an effective one.

Hansbrough will have to make his first fight in his home county, Nelson, at Devil's Lake. Judge Cowan will contest with him for the county delegation to the state convention, and the outcome, while not final, will have an effect on the convention.

Why McCarry Didn't Speak.

Representative McCarry was careful not to make a speech on the Cuban reciprocity bill. That's because he has an idea of being candidate for governor one of these days, and he wants to be sure that his record is right. Speeches like that of Page Morris, Tawney and the rest are likely to come up and be a plague on future candidates. In fact the managers of the Democratic congressional campaign have listened eagerly to the arraignment of the Republican house leaders and the reiterated charge that they are the creatures of the sugar trust. Thus they think will be very good campaign material if the Cuban sugar reciprocity measure becomes a law under the auspices of a Republican administration. McCarry voted with the rest of the delegation against the bill; but it is more easy to vote against or explain a vote than a speech full of Democratic argument. None of the members is perfectly certain as to how the reciprocity legislation will come out. Some think it will all blow over and be forgotten, while others think the insurgents will find they have the popular side and that the elder and more conservative of the party leaders will have to come over to them.

Much Depends on Spooner.

On the attitude of Senator John Spooner, of Wisconsin, depends very largely the fate of the Cuban reciprocity legislation. After the house is through with it the senate will have to pass the same problem. There will be a division much like the division in the house, but the attitude of the senators from the states about the Great Lakes and the Northwest will be dependent largely on what Spooner does. Spooner is coming up for re-election, and it will be necessary for him to get on the winning side—on the side which has popular approval. The rest of the senators have a high opinion of Spooner's discretion and political sense, and they are watching which way he will jump.

Mayor is the Next Step.

President Nicholas Murray Butler the other evening had some friends to dinner, and the presence of the little eight-year-old son was hardly felt until he suddenly came out with the following question: "Papa, when you get through being president of Columbia are you going to be mayor?"—N.
