LIVING COSTS MORE ORDINARY ARTICLES OF FOOD ARE 42 PER CENT HIGHER THAN A YEAR AGO

PRICES HAVE GONE SOARING Butter and Eggs, Chickens and Turkeys, Vegetables and Fruits All Selling at an Increase of From 25 to 75 Per Cent.

The economical housewife has to do some tall figuring these days to make her allowance go round, she must needs juggle herself with the things that a year ago she was in the habit of regarding as necessities of life, but which are now in the nature of luxuries.

The family with the small income realizes too well that it costs considerably more to live now than it did a year ago. The papers have been full of flaring headlines announcing the sky-soaring of meats and butter, but there are not the only articles of family use which have increased materially in price during the past year. There has been a marked increase in everything.

It costs just about 42 per cent more for the ordinary articles of food than it did one year ago.

One year ago today creamery butter was quoted in St. Paul at 17 1/2 cents and dairy butter II at 18 cents per pound. Today creamery butter sells at 25 to 27, and dairy butter 24 to 26 cents per pound.

One year ago today eggs sold at 11 1/2 cents whereas they are now 14 1/2 cents a dozen.

Where dressed turkeys could be purchased for 8 cents, one year ago they now cost 12 cents, while spring chickens which were quoted at 9 cents a year ago, are now as high as 12 cents.

California oranges sold at from \$2.25 to \$2.50 then, and now sell at \$3.50 to \$4. Lemons are now .50 where they were \$3.25, while bananas, which were \$1.50 and \$2 a bunch a year ago, are now \$2 and \$2.50.

Vegetables were also much lower a year ago. Cucumbers have risen from \$1.50 per dozen to \$1.75 and \$2; potatoes from 45 cents a bushel to \$5 cents and higher; sweet potatoes from \$3.50 a barrel to \$7; cauliflower from \$1.50 and \$2 a dozen to \$2 and \$2.25. Onions have slightly raised, as have celery and parsley also; while tomatoes, wax beans, egg plant, turnips and carrots remain substantially the same.

One year ago Baldwin and Ben Davis apples sold in St. Paul for \$1.25 to \$1.50. Now the Ben Davis sells at \$3.50 to \$4. Maple syrup has increased from \$1 a gallon to \$1.25.

RECTOR IS CLEARED

BISHOP EDSSAL RENDERS DECISION IN CASE OF REV. HARRY DIXON JONES

HOLDS CHARGES NOT PROVEN Says Evidence Not Such as to Make the Allegations Seem Probable—Commissioners Concur in Bishop's Findings.

Bishop Edsall has rendered his decision in the case of Harry Dixon Jones, rector of the Messiah church, this city, against the charges made by the diocesan synod some months ago, and who underwent a preliminary trial of several weeks duration, before a commission appointed to take evidence. As was expected from rumors, the bishop has acquitted the rector from all charges made by the synod, and the bishop's decision connotes Rev. Mr. Jones, and orders that no further proceedings be taken in the matter.

Mr. Jones' friends are jubilant, and declare that they never had the least doubt as to the outcome of the case. Bishop Edsall's decision was fully expected by Rev. Mr. Jones. The full text of the decision is as follows:

Text of the Decision. The report of the Rev. Messrs. Stuart B. Purves and Theodore Sedgwick, commissioners appointed to investigate the charges of adultery made by Mrs. Vassau, and other charges against the Rev. Harry Dixon Jones, has been laid before me, and I will, in strictest confidence, report the testimony introduced at the investigation.

Section 10 of Canon XIII of the canons of the diocese of Minnesota provides that "no charge shall be considered as proven except by the testimony of two credible witnesses, or one of such witnesses corroborated by other evidence."

In the present case the charges made by Mrs. Vassau were absolutely denied who claimed to be a stranger to the person named as the adulterer, and who corroborated the testimony of Mrs. Vassau. In my judgment the evidence does not disclose such a connection as to justify the charges, as required by section 10 of Canon XIII, and I shall therefore acquit the rector of the charges made by Mrs. Vassau, and take any further proceedings.

Given under my hand and seal this 10th day of April, A. D. 1902, and in the fourth year of my episcopate.
