NEW YORK, May 5.—When George Kemp died last December he left an estate valued at \$10,000,000 and a number of relatives, each and everyone of whom considered himself or herself entitled to the lion's share of the property.

For many years Mr. Kemp was an active member of the wholesale drug firm of Lanman & Kemp. Neither his partner nor his business associates suspected him of being of unsound mind, for he was always alert and active, and generally managed to hold his own in making a bargain.
