Chief O'Connor and Detective Murnane arrived in Kansas City yesterday and identified him as Arthur Inman, who is said by the police to have been one of the trio that shot down Patrolman Mayer while attempting to force an entrance into Jessup's saloon on University avenue.

PROTESTS AGAINST MURDERS IN CUBA Spanish Consul Declares That the Treaty of Paris Is Being Violated.

HAVANA, May 10.—Senor Torroja, the Spanish consul here, has protested to the military government against the murder of Senor Vega, the late president of the Spanish colony at San Juan y Martinez, province of Pinar del Rio. The consul also claims other Spaniards have been murdered in that province and that the murderers have been allowed to go unpunished.
