twelve state coaches, belonging to grandees of Spain. In them were functionaries of high rank. The next carriage, having six sable horses attached to it, was occupied by the infanta Isabel and Euallia.

Tortoise-Colored "Rig."

A detachment of horse guards followed the foregoing carriages. Then came a pretty tortoise-colored rig, containing the prince and princess of Asturias. It was drawn by six chestnut horses. Then followed a mahogany coach called the "Coach of Respect," which was not a carriage, but a vehicle always directly preceding the royal chariot to meet an emergency.

The king and the queen regent were seated in their carriages and were accompanied by the infanta Maria Teresa, youngest sister of his majesty. It was drawn by eight fine speckled grays, in dark red harness, having heavy silver gilded armor.

The officers of the king's military household and three squadrons of the royal guard closed the parade. The procession, which emerged from the court yard of the palace amid the booming of cannon, proceeded at a walking pace, through the streets, gay with flags and bunting of the chamber of deputies, before the steps of which had been erected a purple canopy.

At the Chamber.

A delegation consisting of twelve senators and twelve deputies received their seats at the prince and princess of the Asturias seated themselves in the others. On the left of the king stood a table on which was a Bible, with a silver crucifix behind it.

The president of the chamber, Senor Vega Armijo, who approached the table on which the Bible rested, then said, amid impressive silence: "Senor, the cortes convoked by your august mother is assembled to receive from your majesty the oath which, in accordance with the constitution, you come to take, to maintain the constitution and laws."

Takes the Oath.

Senor Armijo then drew near to the king and held out the Bible at the same time keeping open a book containing the formula of the oath. His majesty, placing his right hand on the Bible then uttered the following words: "I swear, by God, upon the Holy Bible, to maintain the constitution and laws. If so I do may God reward me. If I do not may He call me to account."

The queen regent, the royal party and all others present listened standing. King Alfonso, who had been seated on the throne and the others also seated themselves. The president of the chamber returned to the table and from there, addressing the king, said: "The cortes has received the oath your majesty has taken to maintain the constitution and laws."

Church Ceremonies.

King Alfonso was met at the portal of the church by the primates of Spain and the cardinal and archbishop of Santiago de Compostela, and twenty bishops, all in the magnificent robes which are only worn on great occasions.

Lukewarm Reception.

The reception met by the procession was, on the whole, lukewarm, composed chiefly of people who had gathered to witness the grandeur of the ceremony. On the Puerta del Sol no cheers were raised until the king arrived there, when he received an ovation, mainly, however, from the spectators who packed the windows and balconies.

The king, who was seated on the throne of his mother, smiled continually and acknowledged the cheers by bowing and waving his white gloved hand.
