MONONGAHELA, Va., June 11.—Seven of the strike leaders were arrested today and taken to jail at Fairmont, charged with violating the circuit court injunction. The sheriff had difficulty in getting the warrants and no resistance offered. Without a leader or supplies the 150 strikers who had been in camp here, started on their march home, many of them avowing their intention of returning to work.
