agents of destruction. Three volcanoes—Madera, Ometepe and Zapatera—actually rise from Lake Nicaragua itself, and under the very shadow of the first named pass. Both Zapatera and Ometepe are in activity. Madera is said to be extinct, but it is a significant commentary on the dependence to be placed upon any opinion as to the character of a volcano that on the same map Mont Pelic in Martinique was also marked as extinct in the chart from which these facts are taken.

Destroyed More Than Once.

Rivas, near where it is intended that the Nicaragua canal shall leave the lake to the westward, has been more than once destroyed by convulsions caused by subterranean activity. Because there are three or four volcanoes, Ometepe, Madera and Miravalles, Florida and many others at little south, below the Costa Rica frontier, Managua, Mesago, Momotombo and Momotombo to the north, and the other volcanoes of the Plain of Leon.

Momotombo was seen by the isthmiian commission when they were on the spot in 1900, steaming and throwing out ashes and scoria. This volcano lies at the head of Lake Managua, only eight miles north of the line of the canal, and has within the last few weeks broken forth in eruption, with an accompanying earthquake, which destroyed the railroad terminals and wharves on the lake. Assooca, one of the three volcanoes in Lake Nicaragua might in a few hours obliterate every trace of the canal west of the lake, burying it in a mass of ashes and lava.
