

# DROWNED AT BATHS

Edward Treacy, 17 Years Old, Drowns Before Rescuers Can Reach Him

## GUARD IS DISCHARGED

Peter Lindgren Fails to Dive After Perishing Lad and Dr. Ohage Dismisses Him on the Spot.

Edward Treacy, seventeen years old, residing at 659 East Third street, was drowned at the public baths yesterday afternoon shortly after 4 o'clock.

Treacy, with three other young men about his own age, swam or floated outside the limits set for the bathers.

Two expert swimmers who were in the pools immediately began searching for the body, but without success.

Dr. Ohage was telephoned concerning the accident and hurried to the baths. The first thing he did when he learned that the young man had died was to order Lindgren's clothing and, finding them dry, discharged him on the spot, because he did not dive for the boy the moment he sank.

## WRONG FIGURES DO HARM.

The gathering of statistics under these conditions is a kind of mockery. It makes the statistics imperfect. It makes them misleading. It gives underestimates, as full returns are not made. Gathering statistics thus does positive harm because of the misapprehension which is caused on the part of those desiring facts.

In no other way can information be gathered with reference to our industries so cheaply or so surely as by a bureau established for the purpose, which shall be presided over by a commissioner of statistics. It can be gathered cheaply by such a bureau, because it soon gets the work systematized, and it can be gathered surely, since it can use the machinery of the legislature which makes it obligatory to furnish the necessary information.
