MANDARINS BILKING CHINESE PEOPLE

Indemnity Made the Pretext of Extortion—United States Not Helping China.

HIS SERVICE TELLS ON HIM

Gen. Wheaton Has Aged Since He Went to the Philippines.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., June 22.—Major Gen. Lloyd Wheaton, who arrived last night from the Philippines on the United States transport Sherman, which was held in quarantine, returns in fairly good health.

Gen. Wheaton left for Manila in January, 1899, and has been in active service ever since.

Gen. Wheaton made this statement as showing what American occupation means to the natives.

"The devastations of war have cost many lives, and the loss among the natives is not to be counted by the hundreds of thousands of lives that have been saved by the American army and military commission, that loss by war."

"Smallpox became epidemic soon after the Americans took Manila, and would have been a great calamity had it not been for the regulations and precautions of the military commission."

"Compulsory vaccination was held in every city, province, town, and throughout the country. In what way we saved thousands of lives. In Gen. Bell's department 300,000 were vaccinated. Later, when the epidemic broke out, it was found that a foothold in the Philippines the army stamped it out by determined means."

"I believe the health officers have the disease well under control. These dangers have been met and overcome by Americans."
