BIG ORE MOVEMENT

Three Roads at Duluth Have Handled 500,000 Tons This Year.

INCREASE IS ENORMOUS

Shipment Is Twice as Heavy as for Same Period in 1901, and It Is Believed the Business Will Continue Through Season.

DULUTH, Minn., July 3.—The three one-shipper roads of the head of the lakes, the Duluth, Missabe & Northern, Duluth & Iron Range and the Eastern Minnesota, have forwarded to July 1 a total of 5,006,786 tons of iron ore, as compared with 2,764,970 tons for the same period in 1901.

This enormous increase for the first three months of the season is believed to be significant of an important increase for the year in this state. The greatest percentage of increase for the season thus far is shown by the Eastern Minnesota, which has forwarded 1,239,633 tons, as compared with 504,143 tons for the same period last season.
