

STOCKS TAKE A REST

Whole Year Passes Without Any Wild Speculative Movement

SUCCESS OF THE FUTURE

Depends Largely Upon the Approaching Harvest, and the Prospect for an Abundant Yield is Encouraging.

NEW YORK, June 6.—If rest is what the stock market requires before obtaining a fresh start, it is certainly having a long period of that sometimes necessary experience. Experience, however, is not a series of untoward events beginning with the Northern Pacific contest and ending with the death of President McKinley, effectively stopped the wild upward movement which began in the spring of 1901. Looking backward, it is remarkable how little injury these misfortunes have done; in fact, they may have proved blessings in disguise, for it is certain that they prevented speculative excesses, which, if permitted, would soon have unbalanced our present prosperity. The loss of nearly 60,000,000 of our made practically no impression on railroad earnings; while Colquhoun's dastardly bullet simply shocked credit in a manner that served to demonstrate its soundness. These troubles brought speculation to a timely halt; and once the momentum was stopped and reason regained its sway, the dangers of excess became self-remembered and the market practically returned to the care of the big men who really controlled the situation, and who were thus obliged to see to it that the market until more propitious times for marketing. How well they have proved their ability to sustain the market is shown by the following comparison of active stocks, giving present prices, those of a year ago and the highest price since Jan. 1, 1901.

Hangs on Approaching Harvest.

The success of the big holders in disposing of their stock will depend entirely on the continuing season, which in turn hangs chiefly upon approaching harvest. So far we seem secure from security. Of wheat, there is no doubt to have a large abundance; of wheat plenty for home and export requirements, and of corn a good crop is still largely in prospect. Excessive rains and cool weather recently caused some injury, but that is nothing more than a local matter. At present, therefore, the harvest prospects are fairly good, and we shall probably have a bumper crop of wheat and cotton next winter than we did last—a very important consideration in view of the fact that the market is now in the hands of the foreign money markets. Apparently the coal strike, like the big strike in the iron trade a year ago, is doomed to failure. So far the time program has been carried on with comparatively little actual disorder, which is to the credit of the men, but as time progresses it is evident that the movement was a serious mistake, and some of the leaders are themselves beginning to be seriously weakened by entering a struggle the inevitable outcome of which was defeat. The miners are entitled to sympathy for the losses they have incurred, but they should choose more capable leaders who wish to succeed—men who can treat the subject as a business and economic question instead of a source of personal grievance, or a matter of mere sentiment. Meanwhile, a few more lessons have been learned that should be forgotten. Among them these: that the right to work is equal to the right to strike; that whoever leaves a position, whether in labor or in capital, and that the sympathizer strike is a failure, in the end only increasing cost or losses to other branches of labor.

Usually a Relief to Wall Street.

Congress has adjourned. Usually this brings a sense of relief to Wall street, but, as the last session was singularly free of legislation affecting financial interests, and as the country pays less attention to congress when the country is prosperous, the adjournment had no effect. Some disappointment was felt at the striking of action on the currency bill, the need of which will be sorely felt when financial panic is threatened, but which is forgotten when the skies are cloudless. In the fall the elections may produce something which will likely be being tariff, trusts and Cuba. As for the trusts, except the most inviting subject for legislative attacks, those institutions are now for less radical action than at one time seemed probable. BIG LEGAL BATTLE

OVER INCH OF LAND

Purchaser Asserts Land Lacks That Amount and Protracted Litigation Begins.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., July 6.—Long and costly litigation is under way in the local courts over one inch of ground. The real estate in question is owned by the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad Co., and is situated on the corner of 13th and Arch streets. The railroad company claims that the property was 29 feet 1 inch wide. Later Lichten refused to settle, alleging that the property had been mis-measured.
