ASSEMBLY PASSES RESOLUTION ASKING RATE OF ONE DOLLAR A THOUSAND

IMPERIAL COMPANY AGAIN ASKS FRANCHISE

Ordinance Providing for Twenty-Five-Year Franchise, Which Was Withdrawn From Old Council, Is Reintroduced and Immediately Referred to Committee.

The Globe's intimation that the Imperial Manufacturing company would again renew its request for a lighting and heating franchise was verified last evening when, at the meeting of the assembly, the ordinance which has been before the two council bodies for the past year, was reintroduced by the local representatives of the company.

The ordinance, which is in effect the grant of a franchise for the laying of mains and the stringing of wires throughout the city for the transmission of light and heat, is practically the same as the one withdrawn from the old bodies prior to their dissolution. The company wants a twenty-five-year franchise, agrees to pay 5 per cent of its gross earnings and is willing to permit the city to reasonably regulate the prices it shall charge for its products.

Wants Gas Rate Reduced. Fast on the heels of the introduction of this ordinance a resolution presented by Assemblyman Schurmer requesting the St. Paul Gas Lighting company to reduce its rate for gas to \$1 per thousand.

Assemblyman Wheeler and several others wanted the resolution sent to the committee on streets, but Mr. Schurmer insisted on its immediate passage and was successful. "If it does not do any good, it can't do any harm," remarked Mr. Schurmer.

The officials and representatives of the gas and Edison Lighting companies have evidently been forewarned that something affecting their interests was going to take place, for a number of them were in attendance upon the meeting. It was not, however, until after the passage of the resolution for \$1 gas that President Lathrop, of the St. Paul Gas Lighting company, appeared.
