CHICAGO & EASTERN ILLINOIS GOES TO THE ILLINOIS CENTRAL.

LOUISVILLE & NASHVILLE KEPT OUT OF CHICAGO

That Road Was After the Property With a View to Obtaining Entrance to the Windy City—Joint Offer Made to the Eastern Illinois by Two Other Roads.

CHICAGO, July 30.—The Record-Herald tomorrow will say: The Chicago & Eastern Illinois railroad has been sold and the purchaser is said to be the Illinois Central.

That the Eastern Illinois has at last changed hands, the news remains, the information to that effect coming from one of the large stockholders, who is also a close friend of H. H. Porter, chairman of the board of directors.

Several months ago it became known that the Louisville & Nashville was after the property with a view to getting an entrance into Chicago. At that time John W. Gates purchased the Louisville & Nashville and turned the property over to the Southern.

Earlier Rumor NEW YORK, July 30.—Reports from St. Francisco received here this afternoon stated that the St. Louis & San Francisco has acquired control of the Chicago & Eastern Illinois.
