

STARTS A RATE WAR

GREAT WESTERN'S ACTION CAUSES A STIR IN PASSENGER CIRCLES

ALL COMPETING LINES WILL MEET THE CUT

\$4 Fare for the Round Trip to Des Moines is Made on the Occasion of the Odd Fellows' Convention in September—Other Reductions Are Bound to Follow the Announcement.

What promises to be a lively rate war between the Chicago, St. Paul and Kansas City lines was precipitated by the announcement that the Great Western would sell tickets to Kansas City from the Twin Cities for \$10.90.
