

WILL ADJUST RATES

REDUCTIONS ON COMMODITIES TO MISSOURI RIVER POINTS CAUSE DISSATISFACTION

TRUNK LINE COMMITTEE IS IN SESSION AT CHICAGO

Endeavor Is Made to Frame Schedule to Be Adopted by Western Roads Jan. 1—Present Rates Must Remain Till Then on Account of Shipping Contracts.

Representatives of the Western railroads, constituting the Western trunk line committee, are in session at Chicago investigating the unauthorized reductions of commodity rates that have been made by roads running from Chicago to Omaha, Kansas City and Missouri river points.

Several of the roads have entered into contracts for carrying commodities under the reduced rates which will be effective till Dec. 31, and the action of the freight men at this time is taken to make arrangements for restoring normal rates to be put into effect Jan. 1. Rates on all kinds of commodities have been raised by the Chicago-Missouri river roads to meet the reductions made by the Chicago-Colo-rado roads and the result has been found unsatisfactory. COMMODITIES TO BE ADOPTED BY THE ROADS

Some of the reductions have been almost 50 per cent. The normal rate on malt from Minneapolis and St. Paul has been cut almost any reduced rates, to Missouri river points is 1 1/2 cents per hundred. The rate on linseed is now 10 cents from here to Chicago and Missouri river points, and 6 cents from Chicago to the Missouri river. The normal rate is 1 1/2 cents. The reduction on print paper from the Fox river district, and points in Wisconsin and from the Twin Cities and Cloquet has been placed at 1 1/2 cents, while the normal rate is 27 cents. The effect of these rates has been seriously felt by the railroads and they hope to secure a harmonious adjustment.
