

### GIRL FIGHTS ROBBER

FRAIL NURSE BESTS THIEF IN ROUGH AND TUMBLE SET-TO AT BETHESDA HOSPITAL

MISS EDITH NORDQUIST GRADUATES WITH GLORY

Professed Deaf and Dumb Man Suddenly Shows Vocal Proficiency When Downed by Doctor—Commencement Exercises Are Preceded by Exciting Incident.

The proudest nurse in the graduating class at Bethesda hospital last night and the nurse of whom the hospital authorities were perhaps the most proud, was little Miss Edith Nordquist, whose quickness and courage Friday night saved a valuable overcoat for Dr. Gravelle, and resulted in the capture of the thief.

As she was returning from a patient's room on the first floor about 6 o'clock Friday night, Miss Nordquist saw a strange man walking stealthily toward the front door with the doctor's overcoat slung over his arm. The thief heard her coming, broke into a run and reaching the front door leaped out onto the porch. Thoughtless of danger the frail girl followed and grabbed the man by the collar just as he started down the steps. The man devoted his strength to loosening the nurse's grip upon his collar.

Wrestles With Burglar. Suddenly Miss Nordquist swung him around, as firmly but a little more roughly than she would handle a refractory patient, and started back into the hallway. Before he could grab the door jam or block the doorway with his body she had him in the hall and was calling for help.

Making many signs and uttering inarticulate sounds, the thief held out a card upon which was written: "Be kind to a poor deaf and dumb man."

"I'll show you whether you're dumb," she said and she whirled him about into the arms of a doctor who had come to her aid. The man was still for a moment until one of the nurses started to call the police. Instantly he made desperate efforts to get away. Dr. Gravelle grabbed the man by the throat and Dr. Johnson laid hold of his legs and together they went to the floor. The man forgot that he was dumb and said:

"Oh, I'd like to beat your head in," as Dr. Gravelle's hand tightened on his throat. The thief was held until the police arrived. At the station he gave his name as John O'Brien and yesterday in the municipal court his case was continued until Monday for investigation.

The graduating exercises which took place last night were very unostentatious. Only about fifty invited guests attended. Dr. O. Solberg, Rev. Carlson, of the Gustavus Adolphus church, president of the board of directors of the hospital, and C. A. Holtkrans, delivered addresses. Rev. Carlson presented the diplomas. Refreshments were served after the formalities. The class consisted of Miss Edith Nordquist, Miss Segra Johnson and Miss Eba Hoorn.
