STILL A CHANCE TO SAVE THE TEAM

PRESIDENT HICKEY CANNOT COME TO ST. PAUL BEFORE SATURDAY

CLUB OWNER LENNON SHOWS THE RECORDS

Attendance Reports for Week Day Games Prove Magnate's Claim That Lexington Park Cannot Support Baseball Here - Fans Must Act at Once.

Thomas J. Hickey, president of the American Association of Ball Clubs, will not be in St. Paul until Saturday morning and there is still time left for the local fans to interest themselves in some movement that may hold St. Paul in a decent baseball city.

Still more evidence to prove that the transfer is now receiving the serious consideration of the American Association was turned up yesterday when the plans for organizing an interstate league to be made up of towns in Minnesota and Wisconsin were discussed.

No change in Western. The Western league will not take in St. Paul while Minnesota remains in the American Association, and the best the local fans can hope for if the team is transferred is a place with what are known in baseball parlance as the "bush" towns.

Answering the claims that St. Paul showed as well as any other town in the circuit, or that the transfer would make money for the local management, President Lennon yesterday made public a copy of the attendance reports for the week day games.

Teams coming to St. Paul receive half of the general admission money, less the 10 per cent that is returned into the league treasury. Out of this one-half, less 10 per cent, the visiting manager is to receive \$41.00 for each game.
