Defending Suit for Dead Italians.

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 23.—In the twelve suits for damages begun in and half of estates of Italians killed in the head-on collision at Seneca a year ago Thanksgiving day, the Wabash road today set up a plea that the Italians were aliens and outside the Michigan statutes covering death wrongful acts, and that they were contract laborers, and when killed were engaged in an offense under the emigration law. Each case is for \$5,000.
