SHUT OUT EASTERN ROADS

Lines West of Chicago Will Not Give Fast-Freight Men Passes.

It was stated yesterday that the roads west of Chicago, who, at a meeting held last week, decided to exchange passes with roads in the central territory, that is, between Chicago and Buffalo, have also agreed to refuse transportation to representatives of the fast freight lines, as well as to the lines in the trunk line territory, which is east of Buffalo.

This retaliatory measure was induced by the unreasonable refusal of the trunk lines to discontinue their agreement to refuse passes to the Western roads.

The lines west of Chicago have also decided that after Jan. 1 no passes will be granted to representatives of the trans-Atlantic steamship lines.
