

NORTHERN PACIFIC GREAT WESTERN ENGINES

Twenty Are to Be Added to Equipment for Passenger Service in the Mountains—First Two Arrived Yesterday and Were Sent to Livingston, Mont.

Two of the largest passenger engines ever seen in St. Paul arrived yesterday. They are not in service, however, but were sent from the locomotive works and bound for Livingston, Mont., where they will be put to work on the Northern Pacific passenger trains. These two engines were the first of twenty that the American Locomotive company is making for the Northern Pacific. Four more are on the way and will arrive here within a day or two, and the remaining fourteen will be received before spring.

The engines are impressive spectacles, towering high above a man's head and swelling out hugely above their mighty wheels. They are masterpieces of mechanical science, embodying massive proportions and delicate mechanical details. These engines are similar to the types in use by the Baltimore & Ohio, Michigan Central and other Eastern lines. The Milwaukee has some engines of this type, though they have not been seen in St. Paul recently. The engines are known by various names. The Northern Pacific will designate its new acquisitions as the "Pacific Type." All twenty, with the exception of one, which will be left here, are intended for mountain use.

The dimensions of the engines will convey some idea of their size. Each has six six-foot driving wheels, with two trailers and two truck wheels. A new feature distinguishes this type from other types of passenger engines. In that under the firebox are two small wheels called "trucks." The wheels base of each engine, from the center of the trailers to the truck wheels is exactly thirty-two feet and eleven inches. The engine stand over fifteen feet high.

The intestines of the monsters are likewise large. Each engine has a 19 1/2-foot boiler, and a firebox 70x90 inches. The cylinder capacity is 22x26 inches. The tenders are capable of holding 6,000 gallons of water and about fifteen tons of coal. Each engine, without the tender, weighs exactly 100,000 tons. The price of one of these steel mammoths is about \$17,000.

The engines were brought from Schenectady, N. Y., where they were made, and they are being sent to the Pacific here by F. H. Belden, who will accompany them to Livingston. The two that arrived yesterday left last evening. The engines were inspected yesterday afternoon by General Manager Thomas Cooper and Superintendent of Motive Power A. E. Mitchell. Mr. Mitchell said they are the largest passenger engines on the Northern Pacific.

CHARLES S. FEE, general passenger agent of the Northern Pacific, has been connected with the railroad for over twenty-five years, having remained with it since it was a small road. He is well known in the system, and is now noted as one of the foremost passenger agents of the United States.

HARRIMAN HEADS OFF PRINCE, Makes Arrangements With Senator Clark to Prevent Competition.

Senator Clark, Cal., Jan. 8.—By making an alliance with Senator Clark of Montana, E. H. Harriman leaves Prince Pontatowski's projected railroad in the air and neutralizes the danger of a possible competition between the Harriman, Clark and the Gould railroad systems. The Clark corporation has agreed to buy the Oregon short line running southwest from Salt Lake to a point in southeastern Nevada. This deal is to be closed in New York within a few days. By means of this Senator Clark gets rid of a parallel line which Harriman was arranging to build. On the other hand, Harriman has an understanding with Mr. Clark, so it is said, by which Gould is shut out from part ownership in the road projected by Prince Pontatowski from San Francisco to Los Angeles, to connect with the Clark system.
