MORE GROUND TO BE HAD FOR THE MARKET

Original Tract Is Recommended by the Market Committee.

The joint committee on markets yesterday recommended the completion of the negotiations for the acquisition of all the ground originally intended for the Jackson street market, and the two council bodies at their next meeting will be asked to accede.

The city now owns all the ground originally condemned with the exception of a tract with a frontage of fifty feet, on which at present is located the Cook barn. The city owns ground both to the east and west of this strip, and its acquisition is necessary for the carrying out of the market plan as first decided upon.
