Importance of the Newsboy.
The newsboy has become a necessary part of life in New York. Any one who doubts the statement need only try to imagine what would be the situation if all the news vendors of the city were to decide suddenly to stop business for a day. There would be woe in the great newspaper offices, actual and serious inconvenience to

the business life of the metropolis, and we would all be wondering how we ever could get along without the ubiquitous youngster with a bundle of papers under his arm.
In Paris there are, strictly speaking, no newsboys. Most of the newspapers are sold from stands, but a good many are distributed by men, mostly cripples, who walk slowly through the streets

with maybe a dozen or two newspapers, crying out their particular paper in stentorian tones.
There are plenty of newsboys in London, but they are not like ours. They rarely handle the morning papers, but in the afternoon they are alive with them. As a rule they handle only one publication. You will see them running through the London streets crying "Sun" or "Star" or "Westminster Gazette," but the boy with the Sun does not have the Gazette, and the boy with the Gazette has no Stars to sell.
What a revelation it would be to a Parisian or a London news merchant to stand, say, on Park row and see our boys, with great bulky bundles of papers containing dozens of seven or eight different publications, and to see how dexterously they jerk out the paper you want, fold it, place it in your hands and make change while you are walking briskly on your way.—New York Press.
