

THE BABES ARE KISSED BY THE PRESIDENT

Their Mothers Hand Him Bouquets and Hold up Their Offsprings for a Presidential Salute—Towns All Across the State See Roosevelt.

OTTUMWA, Iowa, April 28.—President Roosevelt dashed across Iowa today and was everywhere met by large and enthusiastic crowds. His speechmaking began at 7 o'clock this morning when he made a brief stop at Shenandoah, and his last speech was delivered here shortly after 8 o'clock tonight before thousands of people.

His speech here was preceded by a short drive through the city, although his train was late and did not arrive until after dark. He spoke tonight on the good work Secretary Wilson had done in the field of agriculture. The president had as his guests today Gov. Cummins and Secretary Shaw, and the members of the day Congressmen Hull and Heppburn. He will spend the night here, leaving at 4.30 o'clock tomorrow morning for Keokuk, and will arrive at St. Louis tomorrow afternoon shortly after 4 o'clock.

One of the largest crowds that has greeted the president since his trip began was waiting for him at Des Moines this afternoon. He was taken for a long drive through the city and stopped for a moment to address the Mystic Shriners, who were holding a convention here.

Speaks at the Capitol. He then was driven to the capitol, where he made an extended address on good citizenship, incidentally paying a tribute to Congressman Hull for his efforts in securing the new mill law. At Des Moines the president kissed a number of babies. During the drive four mothers, each with a baby in her arms, approached the president and handed him bouquets of flowers. They then held the babies up to be kissed and the president did not disappoint them.

One of the features of the day was the large number of school children that greeted the president. At every place he stopped and at every place where the train did not stop the little people were congregated, waving small American flags. This feature pleased the president very much and he referred to the children several times during the day.

Stops made at Shenandoah, Clarinda, Shambaugh, Varet, Osceola, Des Moines, Oskaloosa and Ottumwa. The president is bearing the strain of the trip splendidly and his face has not been touched by fatigue during his two weeks in Yellowstone park.

Cabinet Meeting in St. Louis. WASHINGTON, D. C., April 28.—An important conference will be held in St. Louis probably on Wednesday night. The special train bearing the president and his party will arrive at St. Louis Wednesday afternoon at 4:10. President Roosevelt and Secretary Shaw will be joined by other members of the cabinet. Matters of importance which have arisen since the president's departure from Washington will be discussed. The cabinet will include the president, Secretary Shaw, Mr. Russell's attitude in Manchuria, the developments in the investigation of the postoffice department and some departmental matters.

MRS. VIOLA HAD A RIGHT TO DEFEND HER FAMILY. Judge Discharges Woman That Shot a Boston Fireman.

BOSTON, Mass., April 28.—Holding that her action in defending herself and family against an intruder into her home at dead of night was entirely justifiable, Judge Ely, of the municipal court, today discharged Mrs. Ella Viola, who was arrested on Sunday for shooting Lieut. Kelley, of the first department, Kelley, who had been calling in one part of the house where the Viola's live, and who was having a personal property behind him. He returned to get it, but, being in liquor, it is claimed, tried the wrong door, which was then unoccupied. Mrs. Viola, who opposed him, Mrs. Viola, seeing that Kelley was over-powering her husband, seized a revolver and shot Kelley, inflicting fatal wounds. Medical Examiner Draper held an autopsy today and reported that Kelley's stomach contained a little undigested food but no evidence of an alcoholic liquor. He added that Kelley's left eyelid was swollen, as from a blow; and that the left hand knuckles were bruised.

RECEIVERS ARE NAMED FOR AN ELECTRICAL CONCERN. Result of Creditor's Suit Against the Helios-Upton Company.

BOSTON, Mass., April 28.—Norman W. Bingham, of Somerville, and Edward Davis, of Philadelphia, today were appointed by Judge Colt in the United States court, receivers of the Helios-Upton Company, New Jersey corporation with places of business at Peabody, Philadelphia and Chicago, and engaged in the manufacture of electrical appliances. The receivers were appointed in a suit brought by King Upton, of Salem, a creditor, with a claim of \$76,000. The debts of the company, it is alleged, exceed \$235,000.
