

RIVER AT FORT CLAIMS SOLDIER

Private Hickey Believed to Have Been Drowned—Body Not Recovered.

Matthew Hickey, private of the Tenth Field artillery, at Fort Snelling, was drowned in the Minnesota river Friday night about 11 o'clock. With six comrades, he had passed the evening at Mendota. They were returning to their quarters in a rowboat when it capsized in midstream and they were all thrown into the water.

All could swim except Hickey and Walker. Walker was dragged to the shore by Logan, and Hickey clung to the gunwale of the overturned boat. He was seen floating down the stream with the boat. His comrades made an effort to intercept the boat, but on account of a turn in the channel, lost sight of him.

Yesterday morning the boat was found stranded about a mile below Mendota. It is thought that Hickey had lost his hold and had been drowned. The body was not found.

Hickey was a popular member of the battery, and had been in the service since September, 1901, when he enlisted in Chicago. His only known relative is a sister, Mrs. Annie Moore, of Chicago.
