

VIOLATORS DO NOT MEASURE UP TO VEGETATION REPORT SHOWS THAT CROPS ARE GROWING FAVORABLY, AND LARGE PRODUCE IS ANTICIPATED—HEAVY SHOWERS RELIEVE DRAUGHT WEST OF BISMARCK.

According to the Northern Pacific's crop report for last week, vegetation throughout the Northwest is progressing far more favorably than was anticipated. The rain and warm weather have done much to improve the crops and from all sections encouraging reports have been received.

The country west of Bismarck, which was sorely in need of rain, was visited with heavy showers Sunday afternoon. Other sections have been well watered and there is now but little demand for rain. Seeding of wheat, oats and barley is completed in all sections of the Northwest and the farmers are now busy planting corn and potatoes. All early planted grain has established itself and the outlook for large crops is favorable.

The Northern Pacific's report in detail is as follows: Minnesota Division—Main line east and south of Staples: Reports from all points in this district are most encouraging. In the vicinity of Anoka and Elk River, where planting has been completed, the best in years; thick and healthy and free from insects. Corn planting is going on and at some points about finished. Potato planting has been completed. Sowing of flax has been completed.

St. Paul and Duluth Division: A continuing rain during past week has delayed farmers very much in getting their grain in low ground. Seeding has been delayed, and there is considerable rain in the air. There has been a rather short crop on account of the delay in planting. Acreage of potatoes, however, will show a considerable increase. There is still some plowing to be done. This division must have dry weather for some other crops. Little Falls Branch: Since the last report there has been considerable rain; too much, in fact, at some points and soil watered. The crops are all coming up and looking well, and the fields are turning green. A few districts report that the plowing of corn and potato ground is delayed. The majority, however, state that planting of corn is well in progress. In the district west of this week, flax is now being sown. Warm weather will be beneficial to flax and corn planting. The conditions for past week over this branch would be regarded as most favorable. One or two heavy rains and several bright days have started grains growing nicely. Seeding of wheat and corn is still a little behind to be put in. Farmers are now preparing ground for corn and potato planting. The outlook is very favorable.

Red River Valley Branch: The prospects along this branch still remain very bright. Observation throughout the valley shows a splendid crop, three weeks ahead of last year. The crops are all through sowing with the exception of some barley and flax. This will be completed in a few days. There has been much precipitation the past week and none is needed at present, although a few points along the northern part of this branch state a good rain would be beneficial. However, nothing has suffered as a result of the heavy rain. All grain above ground has very fine color. Dakota Division—On the east part of this division crops have made much progress since the last report. While from Bismarck west much seedling has been done, but the crops have made little or no headway. The heavy rain has discouraged the prospect. These conditions do not apply east of Bismarck, where the past week has been most favorable. Seeding of wheat and oats is completed. Flax and corn are being sown. The majority of the wheat is now in fine color. On the whole everything looks favorable at present. Sunday there were several rains above ground, looking well. Plowing above ground, looking well. Fargo and Southwest Branch: Weather during the past week has been most favorable, both to seeding and growing crops. There was no rain, and no more seedling is needed for at least a week.
